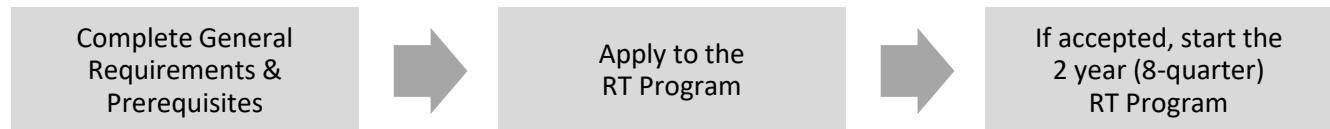


Radiologic Technology Prerequisite Checklist

Use this form to track your progress as you prepare to apply to the Radiologic Technology (RT) program. This form is for your records only and **does not replace the application**. More information can be found online (www.wvc.edu/radtech).



To be eligible for Admissions / General Requirements

- Cumulative GPA of C+ (2.3) or higher.
- Complete all prerequisites with a C+ (2.3) or higher.
- Attend a Virtual Radiologic Technology Information Session (www.wvc.edu/radtech).
- You must be 18 at the start of clinicals to start the RT programs (clinicals start the fifth quarter of the program).
- Complete the required observation in a diagnostic imaging department (8 hours minimum).
- Submit a written essay on the chosen field of Radiologic Technology.
- Submit three letters of recommendation.
- Selective interview process.

Prerequisites

Check course descriptions because some courses have prerequisites (see second page for a sequencing chart). Start by taking the courses you placed into on the placement test. If you are a transfer student, talk to a College Navigator to determine which courses to take first.

- BIOL& 211 Majors Cellular (5 credits)
- BIOL& 241 Human Anatomy & Physiology 1 with lab (5 credits)
- BIOL& 242 Human Anatomy & Physiology 2 with lab (5 credits)
- ENGL& 101 Composition: General (5 credits)
- MATH& 107 Math in Society or higher (5 credits)
- HLTH 123 Medical Terminology (3 credits)
- BCT 105 Computer Applications (5 credits)
- One of the following:
 - MA 113 Bloodborne Pathogens (formerly HIV/AIDS Education)
 - Equivalent 8-hour OSHA/WA approved course (<https://courseforbbp.com/states/WA>)
- One Anthropology (ANTH or ANTH&), Communication (CMST or CMST&), Humanities (HUMN or HUM&), Philosophy (PHIL or PHIL&), Psychology (PSYC or PSYC&), or Sociology (SOC or SOC&) course numbered 100 or higher (5 credits).

You are also encouraged to get your Healthcare Provider CPR card and your Basic First Aid card (HLTH 051).
