- Households with a family member who has received a College Pell Grant in the current year
- SNAP recipient (Food Stamps)
- Medicaid (Apple Health)
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Federal Public Housing Assistance (FPHA)
- Veterans Pension and Survivors Benefit
- Proof of income 135% or less of federal poverty guidelines

#### **IMPORTANT:**

Before you apply, it is important to understand that the EBB Program will end when the funds are expended or six months after the Department of Health and Human Services declares an end to the COVID-19 health emergency, whichever is sooner. Participating households will need to opt-in to continue receiving broadband services from their provider after the program ends. If a household chooses to continue receiving service after the end of the Emergency Broadband Benefit Program, they will be billed the broadband provider's general monthly rate.
